- Save time and energy onboarding new school and care team members with a helpful visual to guide them
- Store and share important notes during appointments, care conferences, IEP meetings, and more
- Ensure that other caregivers have access to the info they need for bedtime routines to emergency contacts
- Share your story without needing to repeat yourself over and over again. Instead, share with those you trust and let your care map do the talking!
